


# Texas Ray Foundation OUR MISSION

### GRANTS AWARDED 2024-2025

For six decades, the Texas Bar Foundation has played a vital role in advancing justice, promoting legal education, and fostering the highest standards of the legal profession in Texas. Since inception, more than \$30 million in grants has been awarded to charitable organizations across Texas that deliver essential legal services, expand access to education, and strengthen communities.

The Foundation's influence reaches beyond statistics—it is reflected in the lives changed, the voices heard, and the opportunities created in every corner of the state. This enduring impact is made possible by the unwavering commitment of our Fellows, whose dedication ensures that the pursuit of justice and excellence will continue to shape Texas for generations to come.

The Foundation funds grants that relate to one of five program areas:

- Legal Aid for the Underserved/Underprivileged
- **Education of the Third Branch of Government**
- **Victim Legal Services or Service for Moderate Income**
- Professionalism/Research/Publications/Forums
- Administration of Justice

In the 2024–2025 fiscal year alone, the Foundation awarded \$1,743,985 in funding to 135 organizations. ### Wade Wellness

Wade Wellness Services is committed to providing family law legal services for disadvantaged families with a \$15,000 grant from the Texas Bar Foundation. The Family First Program provides critical assistance to indigent family members seeking custody of children whose parents are unable to care for them due to abandonment, death, incarceration, substance abuse, or mental illness. Legal services provided by this grant include managing conservatorship or adoption for individuals who are raising a child but lack the financial means to obtain legal custody of the child.


It will also provide legal representation when a child's safety is in danger or not returned to the primary custodial parent, when mediation is needed, or when appointed by the Court to intervene in a family law case. With support from the Texas Bar Foundation, Wade Wellness Services continues to serve as a significant protective factor and resource for the vulnerable youth and families in the Navarro County community.

# **Services**Family First Program



#### Michael, Lisa, and Thomas Pennington

Michael and Lisa Pennington agreed to care for Lisa's sister's two month old infant named Thomas. Thomas' mother was addicted to illegal substances, and she realized she was not in a good place to raise an infant. Five or six years passed, and the family hired an attorney to adopt Thomas. While initial legal work began, no legal ground for custody was accomplished and the family's income was extremely limited. Their money ran out without any change in their legal status of Thomas.

Thomas is now eleven years old and has always felt like Mr. and Mrs. Pennington were his family, however, he was always concerned that his name was different from his parents' name, especially at school.

In April of 2025, the Texas Bar Foundation awarded Wade Wellness Services a grant to provide attorney fees for family law cases.

Presbyterian Children's Homes & Services, a local agency referred Mr. and Mrs. Pennington to Wade Wellness Services and were able to benefit from the Texas Bar Foundation grant. On June 2, 2025, the adoption was consummated, permanency was achieved, and Thomas was granted his wish – to change his middle and last name to match his dad's name.


#### **Texas Appleseed**

Pro Bono Expansion in Legal Deserts

Founded in 1996 by a group of Texas based attorneys, Texas Appleseed is an organization dedicated to providing Texans with social, economic, and racial justice through the skills and resources of volunteer lawyers and other legal professionals

This year, the Texas Bar Foundation awarded a \$10,000 grant to Texas Appleseed to support the expansion of their pro bono network to areas of the state considered to be legal deserts. Community members of these legal desert areas often lack the same access to pro bono resources and services afforded to the larger cities of Texas.

Pro bono services offer many advantages to communities: they grant valuable experience to young lawyers, ease the load of local nonprofits, and most importantly, they directly support the equitable delivery of justice for those facing systemic challenges. By expanding their pro bono network in legal desert areas, Texas Appleseed will improve the availability of accessible legal support for many Texans and bring more efficiency to the justice system, as the expanded network will allow legal experts, advocates, and leaders to share their knowledge and better meet the needs of their communities.



"Texas Bar Foundation's funding has allowed us to take the time necessary to listen deeply and begin building trust with smaller cities that have a rich history of resourcing their surrounding communities through highly localized assistance models. At the same time, we see unique challenges that these cities have identified as "brain drain" and fewer attorneys to staff pro bono projects the same way as global law firms in larger cities. With this grant, we are beginning to see opportunities to connect these communities not only to us but also to each other- in a network of mutuality that builds a stronger Texas."




#### Magdalena House

Legal Services for Survivors of Family Violence and Trafficking



Magdalena House received a \$5,000 grant from the Texas Bar Foundation to provide affordable legal services for survivors of family violence and human trafficking. Most women enter the program with little to no income and face multiple legal challenges, including custody, divorce, and immigration. While families are first connected to free legal services, when those aren't enough, Magdalena House partners with local attorneys, covering retainers and fees so survivors receive the representation they need. This grant ensures women and families can access vital legal protection and move toward safety and independence.

"At Magdalena House, we are immensely grateful for the Texas Bar Foundation grant that helps survivors of domestic violence and trafficking at our shelter gain freedom and independence. With this support, one survivor with a young child is working with a family law attorney to formalize custody, ensuring her child's safety and her rights. This plan also allows her to seek child support, giving her the economic means to care for her child. Without legal support, women and children remain bound to abusers. At Magdalena House, we are committed to providing the legal help families need to heal, achieve independence, and begin lives full of hope."

#### **Texas Accountants and Lawyers for the Arts**

Music Business Legal Programming

Texas Accountants and Lawyers for the Arts (TALA) received a \$9,500 grant from the Texas Bar Foundation to implement educational workshops led by attorneys experienced in entertainment and intellectual property law. These seminars will focus on business education, equipping musicians with essential legal and business knowledge and skills. TALA's legal-based educational services will inform and empower low-income Texas artists in essential legal processes, such as obtaining trademarks and patents, registering copyrights, and creating authentic business entities, among other vital processes.





The El Paso educational series will consist of at least five seminars. After these events, participants can apply for one-on-one mentoring from intellectual property, entertainment, and business attorneys to improve their business acumen. TALA will also reach out to El Paso-based volunteer attorneys in their pro bono database and use this opportunity to recruit new volunteers from the area.

This impactful investment educated artists and connected the local music community, helping to build an ecosystem of musicians, music businesses, and nonprofits that support one another, strengthen the creative community, and expand opportunities for all."





#### **Justice for Children**

Child Abuse Victims' Training and Pro Bono Assistance Project

Justice for Children is a Houston-based organization committed to improving the legal community's ability to protect child abuse victims. With a \$23,000 grant from the Texas Bar Foundation, Justice for Children will renovate its training for pro bono attorneys.

The training includes in-person and virtual seminars led by Justice for Children's lawyers; covering child abuse law updates, how cases move through family and criminal courts, challenges in protecting children, and case studies of children who have slipped through the system. These resources will better equip attorneys to protect victims and strengthen the justice system.



"With support from the Texas Bar Foundation, Justice for Children (JFC) hosted two CLE events in Houston. By collaborating with the Houston Young Lawyers Association and the Houston Bar Association to publicize the events, JFC gained visibility among thousands of local attorneys. The nonprofit also secured nationally recognized experts—Dr. Bruce Perry and Dr. Marcella Donaruma-Kwoh—to speak on child abuse psychiatry and medicine.

With continued TBF support, JFC is empowered to protect and assist even more vulnerable children and families in preventing further abuse."

#### **Aspire A Mindful Place**

Peer Specialists Program as a Means to Reduce Recidivism



With a \$30,000 grant from the Texas Bar Foundation, Aspire A Mindful Place is transforming lives in Hutchinson County. The nonprofit funds a peer support specialist for the Hutchinson County Drug Court—the first rural drug court and only peer support program in the Panhandle outside Amarillo. Peer support specialists, drawing on their own experiences with addiction and the justice system, provide guidance, hope, and mentorship that break cycles of relapse and incarceration. Since the program began, Aspire A Mindful Place has achieved a zero percent recidivism rate, showing the power of connection and second chances.

"Since adding a Peer Support Specialist to our Drug Court program, we've celebrated eight graduates with powerful stories of transformation.

Levias Stewart regained custody of his son, became our Alumni
Coordinator, and now inspires others by sharing his journey. Jovannie
Perez overcame early resistance, connected with our Peer Support
Specialist, graduated from Drug Court, and completed barber school just
a month later. Today, he mentors participants and offers free haircuts.
These stories highlight the life-changing impact made possible through
support from the Texas Bar Foundation."
